

## **SOCIETY OF BIOLOGICAL PSYCHIATRY POSTER INSTRUCTIONS**

1. The poster board surface allotted for your presentation is 4 feet high by 4 feet wide.
2. Prepare for the top of your poster space a label indicating the title and the author(s). The lettering for this section should not be less than 1 inch high.
3. Do not mount on heavy board, as it may be difficult to keep in position with pushpins.
4. Keep in mind that your illustrations will be viewed from distances of 3 feet or more. All lettering should be at least 3/8' high, preferably in bold print.
5. Charts, drawings, and illustrations may be composed similar to slides. Captions for each illustration should be provided, and they should briefly describe the figure.
6. It helps the viewer if you indicate (by number, letters, or arrows) a preferred sequence to follow in studying your materials.
7. You must remove your poster materials at the end of your poster session.
8. You must bring your own pushpins
9. **ALL POSTER PRESENTERS ARE REQUIRED TO REGISTER AND PAY REGISTRATION FEES**

Ideally, your poster should be self-explanatory so that you are free to supplement and discuss particular points raised by inquiry. The poster session potentially provides a more intimate forum for discussion than does the regular slide session, but this becomes difficult if you are obliged to devote most of your time to explaining your poster to a succession of visitors. You might find it useful to have on hand a tablet of sketch paper and suitable drawing materials, or handouts.
